

Historic Lemont, Illinois Established 1836


Come for the History Stay for the Charm...

Nestled among the bluffs of the DesPlaines River Valley lies the historic community of Lemont, Illinois. Established in 1836 and Incorporated in 1873, Lemont's early settlers were the immigrants who came to dig the I&M Canal – the waterway envisioned by explorers Father Marquette and Louis Joliet to connect the Great Lakes with the Mississippi River. These immigrant settlers remained to quarry the famous limestone, "Athens Marble," used to construct many local buildings and historic edifaces in Chicago and Springfield.

In its stone quarry heyday and during construction of the Sanitary and Ship Canal in the 1880's, Lemont became legendary for its "Smokey Row," one of the wildest sin strips in the Midwest.

Out of these beginnings evolved the community of Lemont. Its buildings remain in a picturesque downtown that time has forgotten.



THE STORY OF THE OLD STONE CHURCH

The Old Stone Church is the oldest church structure in the historic Village of Lemont, IL. It served as the Lemont Methodist Episcopal Church for 100 years, from 1861 to 1970, when it was deeded to the Lemont Area Historical Society for a historical museum.

The church was used as a center for community activities throughout its history. During the Civil War, it was used as a recruiting depot. Today, the Old Stone Church is a National Landmark listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The building is constructed of Lemont quarry stone laid 22 inches thick. Beautiful stained glass windows in hues of amber, imported from Italy, were installed at the turn of the century. Graceful curved pews can accommodate 120 guests.

The Old Stone Church provides an intimate yet elegant setting for a wedding, renewal of vows or special event.
